Organizational Setting

Being important food product in the country, the subsector rice has been selected to be studied in Savannakhet province in the framework of the FAO-RAP based project "Global Initiative on Food Loss and Waste Reduction- FMM/GLO/118/MUL" in brief FMM project. The subsector and postharvest specialist (SPS) will work with an agricultural economist (AE) and a gender specialist (GS) on this assignment together as a team of consultants. The SPS will lead the team. The consultants will work in collaboration with the Loss Analysis Team Members of NAFRI and other partners.

Reporting Lines

Subsector and Post-harvest Specialist will work under the overall administrative supervision of FAO Representative in Lao PDR, and the direct supervision of the Assistant FAOR (Programme), and the overall technical supervision of the Senior Food Systems Officer (LTO) in RAP Bangkok, in close collaboration with the International Food Loss and Waste Consultant, FAORAP; the project team, beneficiary and the FAO Partner Case Study Team of NAFRI.

Technical Focus

The main objective of this study is a clear view of the weak points of the food supply chains, and the identification of interventions to reduce food losses and improve the FSC efficiency. The specific objective of this study is the identification of the main causes and indicative quantitative data of food losses in the food supply chain, and the analysis of the measures to reduce food losses on their technical and economic feasibility as well as social acceptability, leading to concrete proposals to implement a food loss reduction programme.

Tasks and responsibilities

The agricultural economist will undertake activities under the following sub-headings:

- A. Specific supply chains selection and prepare study implementation plan
- B. Primary data and information collection in the relevant field
- C. Data analysis and synthesis towards development of a rice loss reduction strategy
- D. Coordination and technical assistance to farmers' field school training and demonstration activities

- University degree (Master's degree preferable) in food technology/food science, postharvest, agricultural engineering, agriculture, agri-business, agricultural marketing or relevant fields
- At least 5 years' experience in agricultural research or support services to the agricultural sector
- Knowledge and demonstrated experience in post-harvest technology/agricultural engineering/agriculture/ supply chain fields for 5-7 years or more of progressively responsible work experience demonstrating experience conducting business analysis and integration programming, including on-the-ground participatory approaches to research
- Strong English language written and oral communication skills and strong report writing skill in English especially on study reports in development fields
